While he may have been unassuming, Del could be incredibly impressive, both in private and as a speaker. Among his friends he counted British nobility, American governors and senators, as well as ambassadors, and Tenderfoot Scouts. He was a mentor of the young, not only within Scouting, but in other fields as well. Del was a patron of the arts, a musician himself and a lover of many types of music, including opera. He regularly attended the Oregon Shakespeare Festival, and personally acted on TV. Del was an expert not only on the history of Scouting but the history of Seattle and the Northwest. A committed Christian, he also served as an elder in the Presbyterian Church. Del's talents and abilities seemed endless, and his zest for life continued from youth through old age...
